Dann is helping the Mobilization department at the EMC to operate more efficiently by customizing existing software to meet their needs as they track the relationships of potential missionaries.

This season of generosity from God greatly encouraged us to whole-heartedly believe God, as Nancy's Bible study taught.

Another baby? Really? In February we received a call from our foster care agency asking if we would care for a newborn baby while awaiting her adoption. We prayerfully said yes. We brought two day old "Tanya" home from the hospital. For the next eight weeks she was a joy to have as a part of our lives. Yes, we lost sleep and missed her when she left. **However**, we were blessed to be able to care for a child for the adoptive family in the same way that others cared for our children before they came to us.



Thanks to encouragement from Nancy's Mom, Nancy is now involved in knitting prayer shawls. In this international ministry women gather together regularly to knit prayer shawls. God's blessing is asked over their handiwork; the shawls are then given to people as comfort in a crisis or for encouragement during a time of life change.

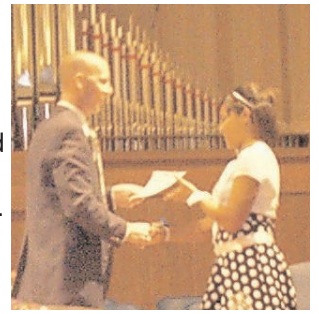
