to grad school. Not to leave an empty bedroom, Anka's friend Kyrsten, also a Judson grad, moved in a week later.


Nancy is currently balancing her part-time work at Target, making a quilt, and reviving her Alaskan sourdough for some yummy baking.



Matthew finished four years at Purdue University in May and moved back home. He quickly found employment working in security and was recently promoted to a supervisor.


Son Ben continues to live in DeKalb working at Northern Illinois University in food service.

- 200,000 People currently enslaved in the US
- 300,000 Child soldiers worldwide
- 800,000 People enslaved internationally each year
- 27,000,000 People enslaved worldwide
- 126,000,000 Children in forced labor.
